

The 2016 Key Stage Two assessments are the first to assess the new, more challenging curriculum introduced in 2014. Tests and Interim Frameworks for teacher assessment have been introduced to reflect the revised curriculum.

“Children sitting Key Stage Two tests this year were the first children to be taught and assessed under the new National Curriculum. The expected standard has been raised and the accountability framework for schools has also changed. The changes mean that the expected standard this year is higher and incomparable with the expected standard used in previous year’s statistics. **It would therefore be incorrect and misleading to make direct comparisons showing changes over time.**” *Iain Bell, DFE.*
